JOB PROFILE

Purpose of the position

The purpose of the position is to develop skilled production managers in agroecological horticulture, and is ideally suited to someone who is considering managing a growing space in future. The Growing trainee will learn practical growing skills as well as developing cropping plans, collecting and processing data, managing staff and volunteers. The Growing trainee will work closely with the Head of Production and growing team at the farm, developing skills and experience in local food production. The Growing trainee will play a key role in maximising the productivity of the farm and helping secure its long term success, as well as helping people in the community have a positive, meaningful and enjoyable experience. This includes volunteers, groups of children and other visitors to the farm.

We are seeking a hard-working individual who is passionate, enthusiastic and able to work with a broad range of people.

Scope of job

- 4 days focused on growing.
- Conducting growing activities effectively including propagation, transplanting, weeding, watering, harvesting and other related duties.
- Report to and work collaboratively with the Head of Production and the second year trainee.
- Assisting the second year trainee with implementing the production plan in the first year, progressing to creating the next season's plan over the winter to follow in the second year.
- Team work including good communication with the whole team (particularly with the Head of Production and Growers), including liaising with veg box staff and participating in team meetings.
- Supporting and working with volunteers at the farm; helping to facilitate a range of volunteer groups.
- We strongly recommend that the successful applicant studies alongside the apprenticeship, through farm trips and conferences, and/or an accredited course such as the <u>City & Guilds Level 2 Horticulture</u>
- Some weekend work will be required over the summer months.

Skills and Experience

The person should have:

- Some food growing experience, does not need to be paid work.
- Interest in and some understanding of agroecological farming.
- Ability to work in a busy environment which involves: Working with time pressure while supervising other people. Dealing with and prioritizing complicated work loads.
- Desire to work in a small team towards the goals of the farm
- Some experience of working with volunteers or managing people is desirable
